We were given a tour of the facility and many questions were asked of my friend about what kind of horse she wanted. She liked them tall and easy going. Several horses were brought out and demonstrated. We also went and looked over the untrained horses. While doing this my husband and I happened upon a pen of weanlings. In the back was one little red horse with a big splash of white on his face. We looked several times at him and realized he was a curly just like the big curly we had at home. When we talked about it my husband said, "I was going to buy you a diamond necklace for our anniversary next week, would you rather have a little red mustang?"
